



Phase I Registration has begun! If you are trying to register for a non-MSE course and receiving an error message, it's usually because you are a non-major, missing the course prerequsites, or the class is full.

Non-majors: Some schools invoke restrictions on certain classes so their students receive top priority. If you are a non-major, you can request a major/override /overload permit for entry into the class. Unfortunately, MSE

cannot issue permits/overloads for outside courses.

Need to find course prerequisites? Check in <u>OSCAR</u> for a current listing of course prereq, then verify with Degree Works that you have the these courses.

Class is full: Additional seats may become available during Phase II Registration.

Whatever classes you don't get into during Phase I, you can try to get into during Phase II Registration. The maximum hours you can register for during Phase I is 18 hours. You can pick up additional hours during Phase II if needed.
